

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Hosts Have (Mostly) Clean Slate

The party is on for country music as "awards week" rolls through Nashville, with the viewing public invited to join Wednesday (11/14) for a somewhat different approach at the 52nd CMA Awards. More on that in a moment. Meanwhile, the industry is doing its part depleting world alcohol reserves at tonight's ASCAP celebration (see winners below), last night's SESAC event (also below) and tomorrow at the BMI shindig – not to mention scores of smaller gatherings.

Looking ahead to the **ABC** telecast, hosts **Carrie Underwood** and **Brad Paisley** told a room full of radio pros that their focus is on the show's entertainment value. "We want to create levity [and] be a safe space for people," Underwood said at Sunday evening's annual remotes orientation press conference. "You can't forget what's happening especially with natural disasters and things like that right now ... but just provide a moment of breathing. Hopefully people can enjoy some great music, see some very deserving



artists win awards and, hopefully, enjoy what we're doing. We want to make people smile."

As pointed out by the event's host and current CMA National Broadcast Personality of the Year **Lon Helton**, the last two years have seen the awards show focused on

its 50th anniversary and reeling in the fresh emotion of the Route 91 tragedy. This year's agenda is about, well, not having one.

"It's actually been really liberating to approach it with the mindset we have," Paisley said. "There have been years in the past where it's like, 'We gotta touch on that. That's too crazy. Or, this is fun. Or, this is kind of poignant and topical.' Instead, [we're asking] what can we do that everybody will get a kick out of? When you look at it through that lens, you throw a bunch of things out. Then you start to look at really ridiculous and interesting nuggets. It's opened up a goldmine. I'm really happy with where the monologue is."

Which isn't to say the show will ignore ongoing California wild-fires or the recent Borderline shooting. "We are definitely going to mention that," Paisley said. (continued on page 6)

The writers and publishers of country's most-performed songs of the past year were honored tonight (11/12) at the 56th annual **ASCAP** Country Music Awards, held at Nashville's Renaissance Hotel. ASCAP Chairman of the Board/Pres. **Paul**

Williams and producer/songwriter Jesse
Frasure presented Ashley Gorley with his
sixth Songwriter of the Year award – making
him the only ASCAP writer to achieve this feat
in Country music. Gorley was honored for
six chart-topping songs: "A Girl Like You,"

Drink," "Marry Me" and "Unforgettable."

Reviver's **Tenille Arts** puts an industry spin on the artist interview:

I grew up in Canada so I listened to CFSL/ Saskatchewan every day. They have been supportive of my music from the beginning.

The first time I heard myself on the radio in the U.S. was when WSM-FM/Nashville played "Cold Feet" on a Sunday morning. My mom was visiting and we ran out to my car in our pajamas to listen. She cried the whole time.

My favorite radio tour memory is the first time a radio station told me they were going to add my single. I didn't expect to be so emotional, but that was the first time I'd heard some-

My favorite road companions are the Reviver regional reps. They know a lot about each area we are driving through, so I ask a million questions. Bonus points if they make me try

I would love to have dinner with the late Johnny and June Carter Cash. I'd ask them about the industry, their music, what they feel their mistakes were and how they made their relationship work. We'd go to their favorite restaurant and order whatever they recommended. Then we'd get dessert to make the night last longer.

My album Rebel Child feels fresh and new, but more country than ever before. Real instruments and heartfelt lyrics. I've never felt more free to be myself than I did while writing these songs. Sometimes I write for myself, but most of the time I'm listening to others and trying to help them through my music. Music helps us understand the bad times and celebrate the good times.

When I was in Albuquerque I bought a blanket and a ring at a cute shop in Old Town. I also went to the candy shop and bought the rock candy they used in Breaking Bad.

The most "country" thing I've done lately is spend a day at my family farm planting 360 flowers for my grandma in her giant garden.

I can't travel without headphones and phone data. I love to catch up on social media, reply to comments and watch Netflix. I also like to creep on my fans by scrolling through their Instagrams to find out more about them.

I'd love to be stuck in Nashville. I've been living there for three years now and making trips there for 10 years. It feels like my second home. I love the sense of community.

Song of the Year was Sam Hunt's "Body Like A Back Road" and Hunt performed it with co-writers Zach Crowell and Josh Osborne. Songwriter-Artist of the Year **Brett Young**



was honored for his two No. 1s "In Case You Didn't Know" and "Like I Loved You."

Other highlights included performances of two other top ASCAP songs: "Small Town Boy" by writers Ben Hayslip, Kyle Fishman and Rhett Akins and artist Dustin Lynch; "What Ifs" by **Trace Adkins**; and a performance of "Hard Out Here For A Country Boy" by The Cadillac Three.

ASCAP CEO Elizabeth Matthews presented Publisher of the Year to Warner/Chappell Music Publishing EVP Ben Vaughn. The company published 19 of the PRO's most-performed country songs of the year and it's their sixth consecutive POTY win. See the full list of winners here. -Wendy Newcomer

The Fast And The Curious

The Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum was the setting for last night's **SESAC** Nashville Music Awards, which joined my prom date in clocking in at just under an hour. The night kicked off with Jamey Johnson and John Carter Cash performing "Spirit Rider" from Johnny Cash: Forever Words, an album that was recognized in the Americana Awards category later in the evening with applause and laughter when attendees saw the name of Johnson's publishing company: Polishit.

Following the performance, host and SESAC VP/Creative Services Shannan Hatch announced additional Americana Award winners: Margo Price's All American Made, Chris Stapleton's

From A Room Vol. 2, Tommy Emmanuel's Accomplice One, Lee Ann Womack's The Lonely, The Lonesome & The Gone, Jim Lauderdale's Time Flies and Lake Street Dive's Free Yourself Up.

Held on Veterans Day, the event also recognized the men and women of the armed forces in



attendance, who received the first standing ovation of the night. A Folds of Honor video package featured Lee Brice and Ginger **Gurley Gilbert Ravella**, whose husband was killed in action in







Iraq. Brice then took the stage to perform "I Drive Your Truck" and receive an award for his involvement with the organization.

SESAC Mgr./ Creative Services Lydia Schultz helped Hatch give out the Country Awards to writers and publishers of Russell Dickerson's "Yours," Lady Antebellum's "Heart Break," Kane Brown's "Heaven," Jordan Davis' "Singles You Up," Chris Young's "Losing Sleep," High Valley's "She's With Me" and Luke Combs' "One Number Away."

Winners were informed by Hatch that their trophies would be kept safe until after the night concluded, but that didn't stop **Shane McAnally** from enthusiastically taking his back to his seat following **SmackWorks Music**'s first-ever Publisher of the Year win. Although Kane Brown wasn't in attendance, his presence was certainly felt throughout the evening with "Heaven" being named Song of the Year and one of its co-writers, **Matt McGinn**, taking home Songwriter of the Year.

Ryan Hurd enlisted the help of McGinn's mother and siblings to present his award, and McGinn received a well-timed call from Brown during his speech. "I love songs—it's the longest and healthiest relationship I've ever had," joked McGinn. "The only healthy relationship I've ever had in my life, if we're being honest."

He closed the night by thanking his publishers at Smackworks, "Y'all deal with songwriters all the time, and I know it's a pretty thankless job. We're fucking nightmares. I get it. We're arrogant and shitty and so hard to deal with, but thank you so much for dealing with us." —Caitlin DeForest

"This is, again, some of our own. But we can't let this madness stop us from making people laugh."

Helton pointed out how close to the vest the 11-year hosting duo holds their monologue cards – being careful not to rehearse

in open settings. "You don't want people to read a bad interpretation of it before they see it," Underwood said,. "You want to take people by surprise and make them laugh, genuinely." Paisley added, "We learned from experience this is how it needs to be done."

Part of that is avoiding advance critiques of jokes from artist camps. Underwood explained they've never intended to give offense. "We try to pick on people who can laugh at themselves," she said. "We've been wrong a time or two, but hey. We tried."



The highly charged political environment will not be a topic of conversation. "We ain't touchin' nothin," Underwood quipped. And experience has taught them to carefully consider how everything they do could play after the fact, especially on social media. "You think a little more in terms of how things can be taken outside the monologues," she said. "How will this be seen in context, out of context?"

"There have been a few years where in the moment everything was wonderful and the next day some click bait is like, 'Look what they did!'" Paisley said. "That's the problem with comedy in 2018. The joke lands, everybody is good and then they [ask] a day later, 'Should they have done that?' We're very careful ... it's a chess game."

During the 2014 show, Paisley revealed the gender of Underwood's baby. Since she's pregnant again this year, a reprise seems possible, but both hosts hedged. "You can't trust me up there," Paisley said, suggesting Underwood shouldn't tell him anything she doesn't want widely known. "I doubt she gives me that opportunity."

Helton asked if the hosts would share a bit that didn't make the cut for the monologue. "We've cut things that aren't funny," Paisley said. Underwood: "Brad's out of the show." Paisley: "Wow." Underwood: "I kid. I kid."

They did offer details of a deleted parody of the song "Havana" called "'Bama." Calling out an Alabama football fan in the audience, Paisley said, "They're always No. 1 and it's getting ridiculous. Congratulations on making college football pointless for the rest of us." Alas, the song's humor didn't quite connect. "It's about as funny as it sounds right now," Paisley admitted.

Finally, Helton pointed to prior surprise guests including Peyton Manning, William Shatner and Hank Williams, Jr. No details were spilled, but someone special is expected. "We have a guest or so," Paisley said. "We're constantly looking for what would be a neat thing." Have a look yourself Wednesday at 8pm ET/7pm CT on ABC.


